Spread over 300 acres, including the championship Wildfire Golf Course, this five-star luxury resort offers rooms and suites, many with balconies and sweeping desert views.

Excellent dining facilities at the resort are the Italian-themed Ristorante Tuscany and the Southwestern-style Blue Sage. Additionally, the resort's Lazy River's large pool and water slide are perfect for sunny relaxation. Moderate: The Sheraton Crescent Hotel, 2620 W. Located in northern Phoenix, it's just ten minutes from Sky Harbor Airport and close to the famed upscale shopping area of Scottsdale.

There are three casual dining choices at the Sheraton Crescent, the Indigo Bistro, Indigo Lounge and Coyote Café. Attracting kids of all ages, the Castles and Coasters Amusement Park is a short walk from the Crescent.
